NOTICE OF RACE

with Amendment Nos. 1, 2, 3 & 4

1 RULES

- 1.1 Racing shall be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Neither spinnakers nor double headsails are permitted in the Leukemia Cruising Class. Entrants with racing experience are not permitted in the Leukemia Class; they shall participate in other classes.
- 1.3 PHRF N competitors only may use double headsails.
- 1.4 For the J/105 Fleet, Articles 9.1 through 9.1.7 of the J/105 Fleet 3 Articles shall be in effect. The J/105 Fleet 3 Articles can be found at www.j105fleet3.org/rules. This is a Level A event.
- 1.5 The notation "[DP]" in a rule in these Sailing Instructions (SIs) means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than disgualification.
- 1.6 The notation "[NP]" in a rule in this Notice of Race means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 1.7 **[NP]** Eastport Yacht Club (EYC) recommends that each competitor review and prepare their boat to the U.S. Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements, Nearshore. A copy of the Nearshore requirements is available at http://eastportyc.org/racing, located under "Racing Resources."
- 1.8 **[DP]** Participants shall abide by all local, state, and federal health and safety guidelines in effect the day of the race.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 The Annapolis-area racing is open to boats in the following classes:

PHRF A0/A1 PHRF N Herreshoff 12.5 J/105
PHRF A2 Alerion Express 28 J/80 Multihull A
PHRF B Cal 25 J/30 Multihull B

PHRF C Harbor 20 J/35 Leukemia Cruising Class

CRCA Non-Spinnaker CRCA Spinnaker

2.2 The Herring Bay and Rock Creek fleets each are open to boats in the following classes:



- 2.3 Starts from Herring Bay and/or Rock Creek will be run provided that a minimum of three (3) paid registrations must be received by 2000 hours on Thursday, 03 September 2020.
- 2.4 Online registration is available at the EYC website http://eastportyc.org/leukemia-cup.
- 2.5 Additional classes will be accepted upon the receipt of six (6) or more paid entries by 2000 hours on Thursday, 03 September 2020.

3 FEES

3.1 The fee is \$125 and includes a skipper's bag. For more information about benefits included in the skipper bag, see the ADDITIONAL INFORMATION section, located below NoR 14. Entries must be received by 2000 hours on Thursday, 03 September 2020. No less than \$90 of the \$125 entry fee will go directly to the Maryland Chapter of the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS).

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 [NP] The event Sailing Instructions will be available on the EYC website no later than 2000 hours on Wednesday, 19 August 2020, and posted on the Official Notice Board, located electronically at http://eastportyc.org/leukemia-cup.
- 5.2 There will be three (3) separate and unique Sailing Instructions documents: one (1) for the Annapolis Fleet; one (1) for the Herring Bay Fleet; and, one (1) for the Rock Creek Fleet.

6 VENUE

- 6.1 The Annapolis Fleets will race on the Severn River and on the adjacent waters of the Chesapeake Bay.
- The Herring Bay Fleet and Rock Creek Fleet will race on Chesapeake Bay. 6.2

COURSES 7

- 7.1 The Annapolis Fleets will sail courses noted below:
 - The Alerion Express 28, Cal 25, Harbor 20, and Herreshoff 12.5 classes will sail drop mark courses on the Severn River.
 - The CRCA-ORR, CRCA-ARC, Leukemia Cruising Class, and PHRF N, classes will sail one (1) pursuitstyle race with a reverse-PHRF starting order using marks described in the Sailing Instructions. This changes RRS 26.
 - The Multihull classes will sail one (1) race using marks described in the Sailing Instructions.
 - All other classes will sail either drop mark courses or one (1) pursuit-style race. The final determination will be defined and described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 7.2 The Herring Bay and Rock Creek Fleets will sail one (1) government marks course on Chesapeake Bay.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 8.1 RRS Appendix V1, Penalty at the Time of An Incident, will apply.
- 8.2 RRS Appendix V2, Penalty Taken After A Race, will apply.

9 **SCORING**

- 9.1 RRS A4, the Low Point System, will apply.
- Handicapping for classes sailing the pursuit-style race will be in accordance with the PHRF Time-over-9.2 Distance Circular Random rating.
- Handicap scoring for classes sailing drop mark courses will be in accordance with the PHRF Time-on-Time 9.3 rating.
- 9.4 Handicap scoring for classes sailing the distance races from Herring Bay and/or Rock Creek will be in accordance with the PHRF Time-on-Time Circular Random rating.
- 9.5 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

[NP] Competitors shall have and monitor a working VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on VHF channels 9, 13, 16, 68, 72, and 73.

11 **PRIZES**

- 11.1 Prizes in each class will be given as follows:
 - 1st Place for three (3) or more entries;
 - 2nd Place for five (5) or more entries; and,
 - 3rd Place for seven (7) or more entries.
- 11.2 Additional prizes will be awarded as described in the Additional Information section.
- 11.3 Participants who compete in all three (3) Annapolis-based charity regattas – Leukemia Cup, CRAB Cup, and Hospice Cup – will be eligible for the Weems & Plath Triple Crown Trophy, to be awarded at the end of the season. The final standings will be a combination of race and fundraising results across all events.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in Leukemia Cup entirely at their own risk; see RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority will accept no liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

13 INSURANCE

[NP] Each boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.

This is a Clean Regatta; all competitors are strongly encouraged to use multi-use water bottles instead of disposable water bottles, and to recycle whenever possible. A competitor shall not intentionally put trash in the water.

Where Does the Money Go? Since its founding in 1949, LLS has invested nearly \$1.3 billion in cancer research, contributing to nearly every advancement in blood cancer treatment. In 2018, participants across all fundraising campaigns helped to raise a record-breaking total of more than \$250 million. LLS has provided over \$40 million in research around the world, with five researchers and institutions in Maryland, including John Hopkins. LLS has also provided over \$75 million of co-pay assistance. Funds raised by this event will help to fund local research programs in Maryland, patient aid and access to treatment, education, and increase the awareness of the mission to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease, and myeloma, and improve the quality of life of patients and their families.
