SAILING INSTRUCTIONS_{V3}

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The CSA Rating Rule applies to all classes except Rhodes 19.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located at **The St. Croix Yacht Club**.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0830 or be announced verbally on VHF channel 06 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4 COMMUNICATIONS

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the SCYC flagpole.
- 4.2 It is the intention of the Race Committees to use VHF 06 for announcements concerning the location of the starting area, order of starts, boats identified as OCS, and other courtesy announcements. Failure to make these broadcasts or failure to hear them shall not constitute grounds for granting redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).
- 4.3 If a postponement is signalled ashore, the warning signal of the first class will be made not less than 60 minutes after the AP flag is lowered.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Racing is scheduled as follows:

Date

17 April First warning 1000 hours 18 April First warning 1000 hours

There may be as many as five races a day. Notice of the last race to be sailed each day will be made via VHF.

- The warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practical after the finish of the last boat in the preceding race.
- 5.3 On Sunday, 18 April, no warning signal will be made after 1400 hours.
- 5.4 Class flags and intended order of starts for the first race of the day:

Class Flag
Multihull Pink

CSA Non-Spinnaker White

Rhodes 19 Lime Green

These are the intended order of starts for the first race of the day, subsequent stating sequences will be announced by the Race Committee over VHF Channel 06

6 RACING AREAS

The racing area will be the waters north of St. Croix. The Race Committee intends to make courtesy announcements identifying the location of the starting area beginning approximately 0915 hours each racing day.

7 THE COURSES

- 7.1 No later than the preparatory signal (this changes rule 27.1), the Race Committee signal boat will display the course to be sailed.
- 7.2 A boat shall not sail through the starting line or finish line unless starting or finishing. A boat that breaks this rule shall not correct her error. However, she will be exonerated if she takes a One-Turn Penalty (see rule 44.2). For reasons of safety, on legs of the course that pass the start/finish line, the start/finish line shall be considered an obstruction and therefore rules 19 and 20 may apply between boats while they are approaching and passing it.
- 7.3 Windward / Leeward course mark diagram is attached as Attachment A.
- 7.4 Distance Race Course descriptions are attached as Attachments B through Attachment E. For Attachment C: Boats should avoid sailing inside the imaginary line joining the designated Buck Island NPS buoys. Boats observed Blatantly violating this will be Warned and if no adjustment to course shall be disqualified without a hearing.
- 7.5 No vessel should sail between Green Cay Island and St. Croix, Unless they are sailing **Attachment E**

8 MARKS

Laid marks will be tetrahedrons and balls.

9 THE START

- 9.1 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the RC signal boat and a nearby mark. See Attachments A and B. Any buoy or dinghy attached to the signal boat shall be an extension of the signal boat.
- 9.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. Breach of this sailing instruction may only be protested by the Race Committee.
- 9.3 Classes may be started together.
- **9.4** The warning signal for each succeeding start may be made with the starting signal of the preceding class.

10 THE FINISH

Except for Distance Race Courses finishing at the Yacht Club, the finishing line will be between a blue flag on the RC Signal boat and a nearby mark. See **Attachment F** for Yacht Club finish detail.

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

For all classes rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

12 TIME LIMITS

Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the **second** boat in her class sails the course will be scored TLE and will be given points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus one. This changes rules 35, A4.1, A4.2, A5, and A11.

13 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the Race Committee arrives at St. Croix Yacht Club, which time shall be posted at the Protest Desk.
- Hearings will be held at the St. Croix Yacht Club in approximately the order of receipt and as soon as possible. Hearings may be open to the public.
- 13.3 On the last day of the regatta, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered:
 - a) within the protest time limit if the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on the previous day;
 - b) no later than 30 minutes after the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on that day. This changes rule 66.
- 13.4 When the Protest Committee decides that a boat that is a party to a protest hearing has broken a rule, it shall have discretion in imposing a penalty, except when the rule broken is a rule of Part 2 of the RRS. This changes rule 64.1.

14 SCORING

One race is required to be completed to constitute a series. No races will be excluded.

15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be given at the St Croix Yacht Club beginning at approximately 1 hours After the Race Committee has reached the Dock. on Sunday, 18 April.
- 15.2 1st through 3rd place prizes will be awarded for the International Regatta with the Perpetual Award going to 1st place in the CSA Non-Spinnaker. The Richard Newick Perpetual Multihull Trophy will be given to the 1st place multihull.
- 15.3 The skipper's weight in rum will be awarded to the winner of all classes with six or more paid entries.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.


W2: Start - W - L - W - L - Finish








Buck Island Course:

Salt River Course:


Start - L - Finish

- Round Mark "L" head to SCYC


