

1. RULES

- 1.1. The race will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. The race will also be governed by:
 - a) for boats in CSA classes, the *CSA Rating Rule*;
 - b) for multihulls, the *CSA Multihull Rating Rule*;
 - c) for all boats, the *ASW Minimum Safety Rules*.
- 1.3. The RRS will be changed as follows:
 - a) RRS 52, Manual Power, is deleted;
 - b) RRS 77, Identification on Sails, is deleted.
- 1.4. The Sailing Instructions may also change other RRS.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at Registration and online at www.sailingweek.com prior to Registration.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channels 16.
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.
- 3.3 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The race will be held for the following classes, which may be subdivided:
 - a) CSA Monohull (Spinnaker)
 - b) CSA Doublehanded (Spinnaker)
 - c) CSA Multihull (Spinnaker)
- 4.2 Boats shall enter online at www.sailingweek.com.
- 4.3 Entries will be accepted up to 6 pm on Friday, April 29, 2022. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the OA.
- 4.4 The OA reserves the right to amalgamate, cancel, divide, sub-divide or rearrange classes at its sole discretion.
- 4.5 All boats shall have a minimum of two persons on board at all times while racing.
- 4.6 All entries must declare their sail configuration at Registration but in any event, by no later than 5 pm on Friday, April 29, 2022.
- 4.7 Each participating competitor shall complete the Crew Waiver Form prior to the start of racing. The form is available online at www.sailingweek.com and will also be available at registration.
- 4.8 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5. FEES

- 5.1 The entry fee will be US \$5 per foot of measured LOA.
- 5.2 Entrants are requested to pay entry fees by Paypal online at yachtscoring.com or by Visa/MasterCard by telephoning +1 268 725 6651. Alternatively, entry fees can be paid in person by Visa, MasterCard, cash or EC dollar cheque at the Antigua Sailing Week office located at National Sailing Academy, Dockyard Drive, English Harbour, open from 9 am to 5 pm Monday to Friday year-round, or at Registration. Cheques or payments not honoured will be subject to a fee of US \$100 plus any levied bank charges.

6. ADVERTISING

- 6.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and provided by the OA.
- 6.2 Any advertising of any other regatta or regatta sponsor shall be removed prior to the race.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration will take place at the Committee Desk at Antigua Yacht Club, Falmouth Harbour on Friday, April 29, 2022 from 9 am to 5 pm.
- 6.2 The Peters & May Round Antigua Race will take place on Saturday, April 30, 2022. The warning signal for the first class will be at 8 am.

7. IDENTIFICATION

- 7.1 National letters and sail numbers shall be in capital letters and Arabic numerals, clearly visible. They must contrast to their background material so as to be easily seen and recorded by the race committee.
- 7.2 All boats shall demonstrate the legibility of their sail numbers to the OA before the close of registration. Legibility may be demonstrated by digital image or any other convenient form.
- 7.3 Any boat without sail numbers or that cannot comply with 6.1 will be provided with identification bow numbers for US\$50 a set. They must be applied to the forward section of the hull on each side of the boat following the application instructions included with the numbers. It is the sole responsibility of the crew to ensure that these numbers are clearly visible during racing.
- 7.4 Any boat whose identification is missing, unreadable or obscured will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

8. MEASUREMENT AND RATINGS

- 8.1. All entries shall have:
 - a) in the CSA Monohull classes, a valid 2022 CSA rating on the official CSA database;
 - b) in the Multihull classes, a valid 2022 CSA Multihull rating on the CSA official database;
- 8.2. Boats requiring CSA measurement in Antigua should contact any of the CSA Official Measurers listed below as soon as possible but by no later than 12 pm on Wednesday, April 20, 2022. Measurement of boats in time for Registration cannot be guaranteed after that time.

- 8.3. All multihull entries must contact Bastien Pouthier – amdsurveys@gmail.com

9. COURSES

The course is anti-clockwise around the island of Antigua, leaving islands, reefs and buoys to port and will be specified in the Sailing Instructions.

10. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 10.1 Decisions of the international jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.
- 10.2 The penalty, if any, for breaches of the RRS other than Parts 1 and 2 will be at the sole discretion of the international jury.

11. PRIZES

- 11.1 Trophies will be awarded at the end of the Regatta to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each class.
- 11.2 A trophy will be presented to the overall corrected time and elapsed time winners of the monohull and multihull classes.
- 11.3 Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.

12. RISK STATEMENT

12.1 Competitors participate in the race entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The OA will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

13. INSURANCE

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate valid third-party liability insurance for the duration of the event.
