# Sailing Instructions for the DROP MARKS RACES With Amendment No. 1 Saturday – Sunday, 4 – 5 September 2021

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### 1 RULES

1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

#### 2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0800 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

#### 3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

3.1. On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 73 for Division 1 and channel 71 for Division 2.

#### 4 CODE OF CONDUCT

4.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

#### 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE


- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at from the EYC flagpole, located on the waterside of the clubhouse.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in Race Signals AP.





### 6 VENUE

6.1. Division 1 will race North of Tolly Point and Division 2 will race south of Tolly Point.



#### 7 CLASS FLAGS AND DIVISIONS

### 7.1. The class flags are:

7.2. A boat shall clearly display two class flags - one at the bow and one at the stern.





- 7.3. No later than 1700 hours on Wednesday, 1 September, the race committee will post the ORC class splits on the notice board.

7.5. Division 2 classes are scheduled to sail two (2) Drop Mark course races on Saturday, 4 September and a Government Marks course on Sunday, 5 September. Refer to Sailing Instructions for the GOVERNMENT MARKS RACE, Sunday, 5 September 2021.

#### 8 CHECK IN

8.1. [DP] [NP] All boats shall check in with their RC Signal Vessel by hailing her sail number until receiving a confirmation hail from the RC Signal Vessel. Check-in shall be made in person and is not permitted by VHF radio.

#### 9 COURSES

9.1. The diagrams below show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which the marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.








Figure 1. Drop Marks Courses

- 9.2. No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.
- 9.3. The approximate magnetic heading, and approximate distance to the first mark shall be designated by placards on the side of the Signal Vessel opposite the start line.
- 9.4. When the first mark of the course is to be a change mark, code flag "C" will be displayed by the Signal Vessel before the warning signal, accompanied by a series of repetitive sound signals.
- 9.5. If only one gate mark is set, boats shall round the single mark to port.

#### 10 MARKS

10.1. The marks of the course are as follows:

#### 11 THE START

- 11.1. No later than two (2) hours prior to the first scheduled warning signal, the race committee will post the starting order for the first race of the day on the notice board.
- 11.2. Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26.
- 11.3. The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the RC Signal Vessel at the starboard end and either a staff displaying an orange flag on an anchored RC mark vessel, or the course side of a green cylinder or tetrahedron, or a green Mark Set Bot, at the port end.
- 11.4. Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other classes.
- 11.5. If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to hail her sail number. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress for request. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 11.6. A boat that does not start within ten (10) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

#### 12 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1. To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

#### 13 THE FINISH

13.1. The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the race committee Signal Vessel and the course side of the finishing mark.

### 14 TIME LIMITS [AND TARGET TIMES]

14.1. The Mark 1 Time Limit, Race Time Limit (see RRS 35), and the Finishing Window for each division are shown in the tables below.

- 14.2. If no boat in her class has passed the first mark within the Mark 1 Time Limit, the race will be abandoned for that class.
- 14.3. The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalized, or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10.
- 14.4. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place two (2) more than the points scored by the last boat that finished within the Finishing Window. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2, and A10.

#### 15 HEARING REQUESTS

- 15.1. Scoring Inquiries shall be submitted within the Protest Time Limit.
  - a. Scoring inquiries shall be submitted via the "Online Scoring Inquiry Filing" link found on the Yacht Scoring event main page.
  - b. Scoring inquiries may be resolved via teleconference or video conference.
- 15.2. Protests and Requests for Redress shall be submitted within the Protest Time Limit. Electronic submittal shall be used and is available via the "Owner's Corner" link found on the Yacht Scoring event main page or via email to <a href="mailto:race.committee@eastportyc.org">race.committee@eastportyc.org</a>. A diagram of the incident, if applicable, cannot be submitted via Yacht Scoring, and should be scanned and emailed to the Race Committee at race.committee@eastportyc.org</a> prior to the hearing.
- 15.3. The alternative penalty acceptance form (RRS Appendix V2) will be available via the "Documents & Forms" link found on the Yacht Scoring event main page. The form may also be emailed to the Race Committee at race.committee@eastportyc.org.
- 15.4. The protest time limit is sixty (60), minutes after the RC Signal Vessel dock time. This posting constitutes the notification required in RRS 61.3. The time limit for a Request for Redress based on an incident in the racing area shall be the Protest Time Limit. This changes RRS 62.2.
- 15.5. The Protest Committee may schedule a hearing prior to the Protest Time Limit if the parties and witnesses are available and have had time to prepare for the hearing. Protest and/or request for redress hearings will be virtual hearings. The parties to a virtual hearing are responsible for having their witnesses, if any, present at the beginning of the hearing. The time and location of each protest hearing will be posted on the Official Notice Board. Parties and witnesses are encouraged to download and review the Protest Procedure Guidelines & Code of Conduct for Remote Hearings, available via the "Documents & Forms" link found on the Yacht Scoring event main page.





#### 16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1. [DP] [NP] A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC as soon as possible either by hail, or on VHF channel 73 or 71, or via the race committee cell phone, (410) 271-7193, or via email at <a href="mailto:race.committee@eastportyc.org">race.committee@eastportyc.org</a>. A voicemail message shall include the approximate time of the message, the skipper's name, boat name, and sail number.
- 16.2. DP] [NP] A boat shall not exercise right of way, cross in proximity to, or interfere with reasonable transit of the race area by commercial traffic of any kind. Boats must take evasive action well in advance of a potentially dangerous situation. The US Coast Guard, ship captains, and bay pilots have been encouraged to report any incident they observe.
- 16.3. [NP] A boat without way may use any means of propulsion to avoid underway commercial traffic, provided:
  - (a) the boat does not gain an advantage;
  - (b) using the propulsion is the boat's only means of avoiding the commercial traffic; and.
  - (c) the boat submits a report (in writing or by email) to the RC by the protest time limit that describes the incident and the boat's actions.
- 16.4. [NP] The RC or Protest Committee may protest a boat for SI 16.2 and 16.3 based on information received from any source. The protest time limit does not apply. This changes RRS 60.2, RRS 60.3, and RRS 61.3.

#### 17 TRASH DISPOSAL

[DP] This is a Clean Regatta; all competitors are strongly encouraged to use multiuse water bottles instead of disposable water bottles, and to recycle whenever possible. A competitor shall not intentionally put trash in the water.

#### 18 RISK STATEMENT

18.1. Boats participate in the Labor Day Regatta entirely at their own risk; see RRS 3, Decision to Race. The OA will accept no liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

#### 19 INSURANCE

19.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.
