1. RULES

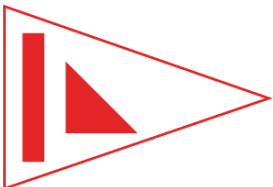
- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2. RRS 90.3 (e) shall apply, except that “24 hours” is replaced with “72 hours”.
- 1.3. All boat and crew are required to abide by Intercollege Sailing Association (ICSA), federal, state, and local laws, guidelines, recommendations and restrictions with regard to the COVID-19 virus, including but not limited to masking mandate and occupancy requirements for boats of various sizes.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1. Sailing Instructions will be available prior September 24, 2021.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. Entry will be by invitation only.
- 3.2. Procedure for invitation, teams within the Midwest Collegiate Sailing Association (MCSA):
 - 3.2.1. Teams will sign-up for the regatta in accordance to MCSA procedures (e.g. at MCSA Midwinters Meeting via the draft process).
 - 3.2.2. Invitations will be sent by the OA to the initial twelve (12) MCSA teams in “draft order” by 07/10/21 and on a rolling basis-thereafter.
 - 3.2.3. Teams must accept invites within 30 days, or their spot will be forfeited.
- 3.3. Procedure for invitation, teams not within the Midwest Collegiate Sailing Association (MCSA):
 - 3.3.1. Teams will request an invitation via the “request for invitation” form.



3.3.2. This form will be made available no later than 06/18/21 via the ICSA List Serve, teams may also visit <http://www.chicagot10.com/glior> after 06/18/21 for a live link.

3.3.3. Invitations will be sent by the OA to non-MCSA by 07/15/21 and on a rolling basis there-after.

3.4. Teams will register on a rolling basis until 08/31/21, there will be no registrations after 08/31/21.

3.5. If a team chooses to withdraw from the regatta post-registration, a formal withdrawal must be submitted by 08/31/21 to the OA. If a withdrawal is not provided by 08/31/21 a team's eligibility to participate for future GLIOR events will be considered by the OA. For teams registered via the MCSA standard regatta withdrawal penalties may be due per MCSA policies.

3.6. A minimum of four and maximum of six crew members are required to compete.

3.6.1. All crew members must be students enrolled in the college which they are representing.

4. FEES

4.1. There will be no fee for this regatta.

It is the intent of the Race Committee to complete as many races as practical each day.

6. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

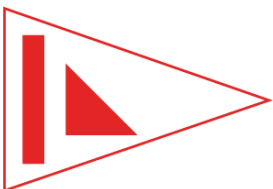
6.1. Competitors are asked to wear their school pennies (sailing bib) from the time their boat leaves the dock until after it returns from racing.

6.2. The Tartan 10 and J105 Fleet will be supplying boats for this regatta. Teams will receive boat assignments no later than one-week prior to the regatta start date. There will be two fleets.

7. VENUE

7.1 The racing area will be offshore of the Monroe Harbor entrance. The approximate location and courses will be in the Sailing Instructions.

7.2 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel for each event will be stated in the sailing instructions (SIs). The race committee (RC) may



report all visual signals displayed by the RC and report OCS boats after the start on the courtesy channel. Information reported by the RC is provided as a courtesy to competitors.

8. COURSES

8.1 Primarily windward/leeward courses will be used. Course diagrams will be provided in the sailing instructions. Courses may be altered to accommodate the area that races are conducted.

9. SCORING

- 9.1 Each boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 9.2 One race will constitute a regatta.
- 9.3 Scoring software will be used, teams will have access to scoring online.
- 9.4 Teams are required to register using YachtScoring.com (<https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=14482>).

10. PRIZES

10.1 The top three finishing teams in each class will receive awards at the Awards Presentation.

11. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 11.1. RRS 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." By participating in this event each competitor agrees to acknowledge that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent to the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.
- 11.2. The race organizers (OA, Race Committee, Protest Committee, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. By participating in this race, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this regatta to the fullest extent permitted by law.

12. INSURANCE

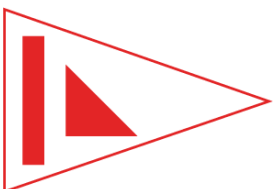
12.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per regatta or the equivalent.

13. HOUSING

13.1 Teams will be able to sleep aboard their assigned boats and should bring personal bedding items. However, teams are encouraged to arrange separate local housing accommodations.

14. FOOD

14.1 The OA will provide food free of charge Saturday (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) and Sunday (breakfast and lunch) for all sailors on board.
