

Grenada Sailing Week in collaboration with Petit Calivigny Yacht Club ROUND GRENADA RACE 27-30 January 2022

NOTICE OF RACE

1. ORGANIZATION

1.1 The Round Grenada Regatta is organized by Grenada Sailing Week (GSW) in collaboration with Petite Calivigny Yacht Club (PCYC) Week (the Organizing Authority's) under the auspices of the Grenada Sailing Association.

2. RULES

2.1 The races will be governed by the rules as defined by the World Sailing Association Rules of Sailing 2021 to 2024.

3. VENUES & RACE HEADQUARTERS

- **3.1** Thurs 27th & AM Friday 28th January Race headquarters will be at **Camper & Nicholson's Port Louis Marina** Grenada
- **3.2** PM Friday 28th January Race headquarters will be at **Carriacou Marine Services**, Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou
- 3.3 Saturday 29th January Race headquarters will be at Froggies Bar, Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou
- **3.4** AM Sunday 30th January Race headquarters will be at **Froggies Bar,** Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou
- 3.5 PM Sunday 30th January Race headquarters will be at Le Phare Bleu Marina, Grenada

4. CLASSES

- **4.1** CSA
- 4.2 Classic
- 4.3 Simplified CSA
- 4.4 CSA Multi-Hulls
- **4.5** Classes may be sub-divided depending on the number of entries, no less than five boats will make a class.

5. SKIPPERS BRIEFING

- **5.1** For Race 1 and Race 3 will be at 1800hrs on Thursday 27th January, at The Victory Bar, Port Louis Marina, Grenada.
- **5.2** For Race 2 will be at 1800hrs on Friday 28th January at Carriacou Marina Services, Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou.





6. SCHEDULE OF RACES AND FIRST SIGNAL

6.1 Time check 0830hrs local time

Race 1:

Friday 28 January, start Grand Anse, Grenada, finish Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou. First warning not before 0855hrs. First start at 0900hrs. Any boat finishing after 1600hrs will be given a finish time of 1600hrs.

Race 2:

Saturday 29th January, start and finish Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou. First warning not before 0955hrs. First start at 1000hrs. Any boat finishing after 1600hrs will be given a finish time of 1600hrs.

Race 3:

Sunday 30th January, start Tyrrel Bay, Carriacou, finish vicinity of Le Phare Bleu Marina. First warning not before 0955hrs. First start 1000hrs. Any boat finishing after 1600hrs will be given a finish time of 1600hrs.

7. SAFETY

- **7.1** Boats taking part in the race are recommended to refer to World Sailing Association safety regulations. www.sailing.org/specialregs (multihulls Cat 3 January 2019)
- 7.2 No part of an anchor shall overhang the bow or stern while racing.
- **7.3** Boats must have suitable charts on board for the sailing area.

8. ENTRIES

- **8.2 Fees:** US \$100 per boat for the three days, or US \$20 for the race day 2 on the 29th January **8.3** Boats taking part in all three races must report for Final Registration on 27th January 2022, by 1700hrs. Boats taking part only on race day 2, must report for final registration on 28th January 2022 by 1700hrs.
- **8.4** For registration to be complete and an entry accepted, skippers must present a valid rating or class certificate, their certificate of insurance, and they must sign the Entry Confirmation Form stating their choice of sail configuration.

9.MEASUREMENT AND RATING CERTIFICATES

- **9.1** On 25 January and up to the end of registration on 27th January a certified CSA measurer will be on site to measure boats.
- **9.2** If you intend to race in the **CSA** classes a valid CSA rating certificate is required.
- 9.3 If you intend to race in the Classic class, you must supply all the necessary details of your boat,



including any previous racing or rating details. Ratings, valid for this regatta only, will be issued by the measurer guided principally by the CSA Simplified Rating Rule.

10. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

10.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. Neither the Organizing Authority nor the Grenada Sailing Association will accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

11. PRIZES

11.1There will be a daily prize-giving after each day's racing for the first boat crossing the finish line. At the final prize-giving on the last day of racing, a prize for first overall and prizes to the first and second in each class.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

12.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. Neither the Organizing Authority nor the Grenada Sailing Association will accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

13. INSURANCE

- **13.1** Each boat shall be insured with valid, adequate third-party liability insurance for the duration of the regatta.
- **13.2** Viewing of the certificate of insurance by the OA (see NoR 8.4 above) does not constitute indemnification of competitors nor will GSW be held liable for misrepresentation of cover by participants.

14. AMENDMENTS

14.1 GSW / PCYC reserves the right to amend this notice. Any amendments will be posted on the official Notice Board at Race Headquarters and on Yachtscoring.
