

2024 Friday Night Series Sailing Instructions

1. Rules

- **1.1.** The races will be governed by the current edition of *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) except as may be altered by the Notice of Race or by these Sailing Instructions, and the current PHRF regulations as administered by the Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound (YRALIS). PHRF weight limits will not be in effect.
- **1.2.** All boats shall comply with the US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements (USSER) for nearshore races. The VHF radio shall be capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 05A.
- **1.3** Prior to the first race signal of the day, each boat shall check in with the signal boat by sailing by and declaring her intention. There will be no check-in by radio.
- **1.4.** A boat withdrawing must inform the Race Committee as soon as possible but no later than leaving the racing area.

2. Notices to Competitors

- **2.1.** Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board, which is the 2024 Friday Night Series event page on yachtscoring.com.
- **2.2.** The race committee may make broadcasts on VHF channel 05A for communications to competitors before or during the race. The timing, order of the broadcast, or the failure of the competitors to hear the broadcast, will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 29.1 and 60.1(b)

3. Changes to the Sailing Instructions

3.1. Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 1200 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. Oral changes may be made on the water via announcements over VHF Channel 05A. This changes Race Signals.

4. Signals Made Ashore

- **4.1.** Signals made ashore will be displayed from the Signal Boat while at the dock.
- **4.2.** When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes." This changes RRS Race Signals.

5. Schedule of Races

- **5.1.** The schedule of races will be posted on the Stamford Yacht Club website (www.stamfordyc.com).
- **5.2.** Harbor start for the Friday Night Series shall be at 1730. It is the intention of the Race Committee for the Friday Night Series that the first signal will be at 1830 for each Friday evening race.
- **5.3.** No warning signal for the Friday Night Series will be made after 1930 for evening race

5.4 It is the intention of the race committee to run one race on any race day.

6. Racing Areas

Attachment 2, "SYC Racing Chart," indicates the location of the racing area.

7. The Courses

- **7.1.** The course will be indicated on a course board mounted on the Signal Boat. It is also the intention, but not the obligation, of the Race Committee to announce the course via radio.
- **7.2.** Marks shall be rounded in succession in the order displayed, from left to right, so that the boat's rhumbline course to the next mark does not cross the rhumbline course from the previous mark.
- **7.3.** If Mark "W" is used, the compass bearing and distance will appear on the top line on the course board.
- **7.4.** At or prior to the first warning signal, the course will be signaled from the Signal Boat. This modifies RRS 27.1
- **7.5.** Display of code flag "2nd Repeater" along with the course signals indicates that the course is to be sailed twice around with the start mark (pin end) being treated as a turning mark of the course.

8. Marks

- **8.1.** The marks of the course will be designated on Attachment 1, "Mark Designations" of these Sailing Instructions, unless otherwise noted in Special Sailing Instructions.
- **8.2.** When "S" is a mark on the course, the Start/Finish Mark "S" and the Signal boat will serve as a gate. Upon returning from a signaled mark to "S", all boats must pass through the "gate" and proceed to the next signal mark.
- **8.3.** Regardless of what tack they are on, when two boats are approaching the gate from opposite directions, the one sailing downwind will have right of way. This modifies rules 10 and 11 under this situation only.
- **8.4.** Except when passing through the gate (as defined in 9.2) all marks shall be rounded so that a boat's rhumbline course to the next mark does not cross the rhumbline course from the previous mark. When courses between marks are reciprocal, the mark shall be left to port.
- **8.5.** When a temporary mark is being used, the race committee shall display from a course board the compass course and distance to that mark at the previous rounding mark.

9. The Start

9.1. Races will be started by using Rule 26 of the RRS, with the following addition: An attention signal (flag F with one sound) will be made 5 minutes before the first Warning Signal for the first starting class only. One minute before the first Warning Signal, code flag F will be removed without a sound signal.

- **9.2.** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the course side of a temporary mark set by the Race Committee.
- **9.3.** The Signal Boat will be southerly of the westerly breakwater.
- **9.4.** If more than one boat starts, the race will be scored as a qualifying race for that series.

10. Recalls

10.1. RRS 29.1 is hereby modified to allow that, in the event of an Individual Recall, infringing boats may be recalled by name or sail number, by loud hailer or over the VHF radio. Failure to make a radio call or the failure of a boat to hear a recall or the order of such calls shall not be grounds for redress.

11. The Finish

- 11.1. The finish line shall be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the signal boat and the last mark signaled.
- 11.2. A race may be shortened at any mark on the course. A shortened course will be signaled with code flag "S" and two sound signals. If the race is intended to be shortened for one class and not others, the race committee will display the class flag along with the "S" flag for the class that will have its course shortened.
- **11.3.** The finishing boat may be stationed on either side of the finishing mark. Boats shall finish in the direction of the rhumbline (compass course) from the last turning mark.

12. Time Limit

12.1. The time limit for any class's race will be two hours.

13. Protests and Requests for Redress

- **13.1.** A boat intending to protest shall so inform the race committee upon finishing or withdrawing. Protests shall be submitted on standard forms obtained from the Stamford Yacht Club front desk or from the Race Committee. Protests shall be submitted in writing with the Race Committee no later than one hour after the Race Committee has returned to the dock. The Race Committee will post its arrival time on the Official Notice Board.
- 13.2. To inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit. Hearings will be held at the Stamford Yacht Club and will be scheduled at the discretion of the Protest Committee.
- **13.3.** In conformance with RRS 61.1(b), and to inform boats of protests received, notices will be posted as soon as practicable after receipt.

14 ARBITRATION

14.1Arbitration will be held in accordance with Appendix T.

14.2One representative from each boat will meet with an arbitrator unless the protestor requests that the protest be withdrawn.

- **14.3** The Arbitrator will not be a member of the protest committee that hears the protest but will be permitted to observe the testimony given and offer testimony. This changes RRS 63.3 (a).
- **14.4.** It is intended that protests be heard at Stamford Yacht Club on date and time to be determined by the parties in conversation with the mediator. It is intended but not required that such hearing be scheduled within 15 days following the race in which the protest occurred.

15 Scoring

15.1 The Cox-Sprague method of scoring will be used for vessels which qualified for the series. Vessels must sail one more than half the races conducted to qualify for the series.

16 Radio Communication

- **16.1** Except in the case of an emergency, while racing, a boat shall neither make nor receive wireless communication not simultaneously available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 16.2 It is the intention of the Race committee to monitor VHF channel 05A during all races.

17 Disclaimer of Liability

17.1 Competitors participate in any race of the series entirely at their own risk. See Rule 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after any race in this series.
