GUADELOUPE TO ANTIGUA RACE

FRIDAY, APRIL 28, 2017

NOTICE OF RACE

Antigua Yacht Club, the Antigua Sailing Week Committee and Le Triskell Association of Guadeloupe invite you to compete in the Guadeloupe to Antigua Race. The Organising Authority is the Antigua Sailing Week Committee affiliated with the Antigua and Barbuda Sailing Association. The Race Headquarters will be located at Antigua Yacht Club, Falmouth Harbour, Antigua.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Race will be governed by the Rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 – 2020* ('RRS').
- 1.2 The Race will also be governed by:
 - (a) for boats in CSA Classes, the *CSA Rating Rule*;
 - (b) for boats in Bareboat Classes, the *ASW Requirements for Bareboat Class*;
 - (c) for multihulls, the *Local Multihull Rating Rule*;
 - (d) for classic boats, the *CSA Classic Rating Rule*;
 - (e) for all boats, the *ASW Minimum Safety Rules*.
- 1.3 RRS 55, Trash Disposal, is changed by adding the following sentence after the first sentence: 'However, discarding biodegradable, environmentally friendly bands when setting a sail is permitted.'
- 1.4 For Multihull classes only, *ASW Minimum Safety Rule #2* with respect to lifelines will not apply.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The Race will be held for the following classes which may be subdivided:
 - (a) CSA Monohull;
 - (b) CSA Bareboat;
 - (c) Multihull; and
 - (d) CSA Classic.

- 2.2 All boats are encouraged to enter online at www.sailingweek.com by 5 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017, however last-minute entries will be accepted at Registration in Deshaies, Guadeloupe at a location to be announced.
- 2.3 The Organising Authority reserves the right to amalgamate, cancel, divide, sub-divide or rearrange classes at its sole discretion.
- 2.4 All entries shall declare their sail configuration at Registration by no later than 8 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017.
- 2.5 All boats shall have a minimum of two crew at all times during racing.

3. FEES

- 3.1 For all classes the entry fee will be US \$50 for boats up to and including 50 feet of length overall. For all other boats, the entry fee will be US \$1 per foot of length overall.
- 3.2 All boats are encouraged to pay their entry fee online at https://www.sailingweek.com/entry-fee/?form_id=7 by 5 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017 but payment for last-minute entries will also be accepted at Registration **in cash only**.

4. REGISTRATION AND SKIPPERS' BRIEFING

- 4.1 Registration and a Skippers' Briefing will take place at a location to be announced in Deshaies, Guadeloupe from 6 to 8 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017.
- 4.2 For safety reasons, the representative entering each boat is required to provide a list of names and contact information for each member of the boat's crew.

5. IDENTIFICATION

All boats are requested to register their sail numbers for identification purposes. Boats may be provided with class flags to be flown from the backstay or other prominent place on the boat for purposes of identifying them as participants at the finish line.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 For all classes, the Race will take place on Friday, April 28, 2017.
- 6.2 The warning signal for the first class will be at 8:50 am.
- 6.3 The time limit to finish the race is 5:30 pm.

7. MEASUREMENT AND RATINGS

- 7.1 All multihull entries must contact the Antigua Sailing Week regatta measurer at rating@pouthier.eu to arrange for measurement and to obtain a rating certificate. Multihull ratings must be assigned by no later than 5 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017. All information submitted is subject to verification by the multihull measurer.
- 7.2 Classic boats will be given a CSA Classic Rating with the exception of Spirit of Tradition boats which must have a valid 2017 digitally-certified CSA Rating certificate.
- 7.3 Boats in the Bareboat Class shall have a valid 2017 digitally-certified CSA Bareboat Rating certificate.
- 7.4 All other boats shall have a valid 2017 digitally-certified CSA Rating certificate.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at Registration and online at www.sailingweek.com prior to Registration.

9. COURSE

The course will be from north of Deshaies, Guadeloupe to south of English Harbour, Antigua.

10. PROTEST COMMITTEE AND PENALTIES

The penalty, if any, for breaches of the RRS other than Parts 1 and 2 will be at the sole discretion of the International Jury. This changes RRS 64.1.

11. CUSTOMS AND IMMIGRATION CLEARANCE

All boats are advised that Customs and Immigration clearance is mandatory into and out of Antigua and Guadeloupe. In Guadeloupe, clearance can be done at The Pelican cyber café on the main road in the Village of Deshaies, open from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm and 4 pm to 7 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017. 12. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate valid third-party liability insurance for the duration of the Race.

13. MEDIA RIGHTS

By participating in this event, competitors grant to the Organising Authority and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio, and video recordings, and other production of them and/or their boat made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue until their final departure, without compensation.

14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the Guadeloupe to Antigua Race entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the Race.
