50TH ANTIGUA SAILING WEEK

GUADELOUPE TO ANTIGUA RACE FRIDAY, APRIL 28, 2017

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Antigua Yacht Club, the Antigua Sailing Week Committee and the Triskell Association of Guadeloupe invite you to compete in the Guadeloupe to Antigua Race. The Organising Authority is the Antigua Sailing Week Committee affiliated with the Antigua and Barbuda Sailing Association. The Race Headquarters will be located at Antigua Yacht Club, Falmouth Harbour, Antigua. Times are Antigua Standard Time.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Race will be governed by the Rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* ('RRS').
- 1.2 The Race will also be governed by:
 - (a) for boats in CSA Classes, the *CSA Rating Rule*;
 - (b) for boats in Bareboat Classes, the *ASW Requirements for Bareboat Class*;
 - (c) for multihulls, the *Local Multihull Rating Rule*;
 - (d) for classic boats, the *CSA Classic Rating Rule*;
 - (e) for all boats, the *ASW Minimum Safety Rules*.
- 1.3 For Multihull classes only, *ASW Minimum Safety Rule #2* with respect to lifelines will not apply.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to these Sailing Instructions will be posted at Registration in Deshaies, Guadeloupe by 7 pm on Thursday, April 27, 2017.

3. SCHEDULE OF RACES

The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first class is 8:50 am on Friday, April 28, 2017.

4. CLASSES

- 4.1 Classes will be divided by type of boat and may include racing, cruising, bareboat, multihull and classic, all of which may be subdivided.
- 4.2 Boats must declare their intended sail configuration at the skippers' briefing to be held at the Reception hosted by the Deshaies Tourism Department on the land adjacent to the marina in the Village of Deshaies (see location attached) by no later than 8 pm on Thursday, April 27. The declared

sail configuration must not change after that time. This also applies to boats with alternate headsail ratings.

5. IDENTIFICATION

- 5.1 All boats with sail numbers must provide them at Registration and display them while racing.
- 5.2 Boats may be requested to fly a flag for the purpose of identification as a participant in the Guadeloupe to Antigua Race which if issued must be flown from the backstay or, if that is not possible, from another prominent position on the boat at all times while racing. Flags, if used, will be provided to all boats at Registration.

6. THE COURSE

The course will be from north of Deshaies, Guadeloupe to south of English Harbour, Antigua.

7. THE START

- 7.1 The Race will start in accordance with RRS 26 with the warning signal being made 10 minutes before the starting signal (10 – 4 – 1 – Start).
- 7.2 The starting line will be located at approximately 16°21.00'N, 61°47.00'W and will be from south to north between a staff on the Committee Boat displaying an Antigua Yacht Club burgee and a mark to its west.

8. THE FINISH

- 8.1 The finish line shall be just east of the entrance to English Harbour, between a red flag on the hill located at 17°00.038'N - 61°45.641'W and an orange mark to its west.
- 8.2 All boats are requested to monitor VHF Channel 12 and shall call the Race Committee when they are approximately ¼ mile from the finish line giving the boat's name, rating, sail number if applicable, and if it is possible to identify them, the names of the boats immediately ahead and behind. The Race Committee can also be contacted on +1 268 783 8815. Boats that fail to contact the Race Committee prior to finishing may not be scored.
- 8.3 The time limit for all classes will be 5 pm. Boats not finishing by the time limit will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

9. PROTESTS

- 9.1 Protest forms will be available at the Protest Desk at Antigua Yacht Club. The protest time limit is one hour after a boat's finishing time.
- 9.2 Notices informing competitors of the place and approximate time of each hearing will be posted at the Protest Desk within 10 minutes of a protest or request for redress being filed. Hearings will commence as soon as possible afterwards.

10. RADIO COMMUNICATION

The Race Committee will stand by on VHF channel 12.

11. SAFETY

A boat that retires shall notify the Race Committee on VHF channel 12 as soon as it is within radio range or by calling +1 268 783 8815 and shall use its best efforts to receive an acknowledgement.

12. RESULTS AND PRIZES

12.1 Results will be posted at the Committee Desk at Antigua Yacht Club and at www.sailingweek.com as soon as possible after the race.

12.2 The prize-giving will be held at Antigua Yacht Club at approximately 5:30 pm on Friday, April 28, 2017.
