



Notice of Race

2010 American Yacht Club Fall Regatta

September 25-26 and October 2-3, 2010

Organizing Authority

The American Yacht Club

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by;

- the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS),
 - the IRC rules, Parts A, B, and C for the IRC Division,
 - the current PHRF Regulations as administered by the YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS) for the PHRF Division,
 - the minimum Equipment Recommendations of the YRALIS (Category C) for all classes,
- except as any of these are changed by this Notice of Race or by the sailing instructions.

The crew number or crew weight limitation specified in a boat's IRC, PHRF or One Design certificate or applicable class rule shall not be exceeded, except that one additional crew member less than age 14 shall not be counted against the crew number or weight limitation. Entrants who intend to carry an additional crew member less than age 14 shall so indicate by email to aycrc@americanyc.org no later than 1800 on Wednesday September 22, 2010.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The regatta is open to offshore boats racing under IRC, PHRF (with handicaps of 90 and higher), Level, and One Design rules. Boats (except boats of foreign registry) must be enrolled in the YRALIS or another US SAILING association. Boats with a PHRF rating lower than 90 must race under IRC, Level or One Design rules.

3. ENTRY

Online entry is required, paper entries will not be accepted. Online registration and electronic entry fee payment are available at <http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=347>. No entries or changes to measurement certificates or to an IRC boat's TCC will be accepted after 1800 on Wednesday September 22, 2010.

Each boat must have a current, valid IRC, One Design or YRALIS PHRF certificate, as appropriate. PHRF certificates must be available on the YRA website, faxed to American Yacht Club at (914) 967-5340, or emailed to aycrc@americanyc.org no later than 1800 on Wednesday September 22, 2010.

IRC certificate rating information must be available on the US Sailing website at www.ussailing.org/offshore/IRC/Handicaps.asp, or the certificate must be faxed to American Yacht Club at (914) 967-5340 or emailed to aycrc@americanyc.org no later than 1800 on Wednesday September 22, 2010.

4. FEES

The entry fee is \$175. Completed entries must be received no later than Friday, September 17, 2010. Entries received after this date will be accepted if they include a \$50.00 late fee. ***Boats that were entered in both the American Yacht Club Spring Series and Fall Regatta for a reduced combined fee need not submit any further entry for the Fall Regatta unless the boat's rating certificate has changed.***

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5. GULFSTREAM SERIES

The American Yacht Club Spring and Fall Regattas are qualifying events for the IRC Gulfstream Series. IRC certificates for boats entered in the Gulfstream Series must be endorsed certificates.

6. SCHEDULE

Races for all classes will be run on September 25 and 26, and October 2 and 3. More than one race may be held on any day at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. The first warning signal is scheduled to be made at 1055 each day.

7. VENUE

Races will be conducted on two separate courses from starting areas located approximately mid-Sound, south or east of Milton Point, Rye, New York. The approximate positions of the starting areas will be announced at 1015 each day for all classes on VHF channels 71 and 69.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at the American Yacht Club front desk and at <http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=347> by noon on the day before the first race and from the Race Committee support boats in the starting areas.

9. NOTICES

Notices, including notices that may amend the Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions, will be posted on <http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=347> and on the Race Committee notice board by 2000 the day before changes will take effect. Notices will also be broadcast on VHF channel 71 and 69 at 0930 on race days.

10. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on <http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=347> and the Race Committee notice board before 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

11. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION

Each boat shall carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving VHF channels 71 and 69. Except in an emergency or to report a protest or withdrawal, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones and data communication.

12. CLASSES

Boats will be placed in classes (designated by numbers 1, 2, 3, etc.) at the discretion of the Race Committee. Additional Level, One Design and Handicap classes may be established at the discretion of the Race Committee. A listing of entrants by class and starting area (south or east of Milton Point) will be available at the club front desk and on the American Yacht Club web site by noon on the day before the first race and from the Race Committee support boats in the starting areas.

13. CLASS FLAGS

Each boat shall display the numeral pennant for its class on its backstay or, in the absence of a backstay, from its stern rail.

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14. ARBITRATION

For protests involving a rule of Part 2, a brief arbitration hearing will be held prior to a protest hearing. This changes Part 5, Section B, of the RRS.

15. SCORING

Multiple races are scheduled, of which one shall be completed to constitute a series. IRC classes will be scored using Time on Time. PHRF classes will be scored using the handicaps provided by the YRALIS, and course distance.

16. PRIZES

Series prizes for each class will be awarded as follows: a first place prize for two or more entries; second place for four or more; and third place for six or more.

The RAMPANT, 1888 and EDWARD RICHARDS TROPHIES will be awarded to the boats which, in the judgment of the Race Committee, have the best performance in the PHRF, Level, and IRC divisions respectively.

Prizes will be awarded at American Yacht Club after the final race and protest hearings.

17. MOORINGS

A limited number of moorings will be available. Reservations are essential. Contact Bud Puterbaugh, AYC Harbor Captain, for rates and availability.

18. NAVIGATION RULES

All boats are cautioned to observe the Navigation Rules of the Road and to yield right of way to vessels restricted in their ability to maneuver, especially to tugs and barges. Any boat observed to impede such traffic may be protested by the Race Committee.

19. WEBSITE

The Race Committee will post the Notice of Regatta, Sailing Instructions, Scratch Sheet, and results on <http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=347>. Competitors should consult the official Race Committee Notice Board for final information.

20. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

As a condition of the participation of any boat in any race or related activity sponsored or undertaken by American Yacht Club, the owner and each crew member agree that the safety of the boat and her crew and the decision whether or not to start or continue to race is solely their responsibility. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. All competitors waive all claims which he or she, or any heir, representative, successor or assignee, may have against American Yacht Club and its officers, trustees, members, committees, employees or agents, arising out of or in any way connected with participation in such race or activity.
