SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)* and these Sailing Instructions, including Attachments A, B, C, D and E.
- **1.2** For boats racing in:
 - (a) For IRC Divisions: the Ocean Safety IRC Rules 2011, Parts A, B and C shall apply. Boats racing in IRC divisions shall hold endorsed certificates. Each boat's corrected time (CT) will be calculated to the nearest second (round 0.5 upward) by multiplying her elapsed time (ET) by her TCC (CT=ET*TCC).
 - (b) For One Design classes, their respective class rules will apply except that the J120 class will be sailing under Fleet Five class rules, and the J105 class will be sailing under Fleet One class rules.

2. REGISTRATION

Eligible boats shall complete registration with the StFYC Race Office prior to 1900 hours on September 7, 2011. Registration after this date will require the written approval by the StFYC Race Manager.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS – CHANGE TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- **3.1** Official Notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board located in the hallway adjacent to the side (Regatta) entrance of StFYC.
- 3.2 Any changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted by 0930 hours on the day they are to take effect, except any change to Sailing Instruction 5, Number & Schedule of Races, will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before it takes effect.
- **3.3** Questions regarding the Sailing Instructions may be submitted in writing to the Race Committee. Questions and written responses will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 3.4 The Race Committee may make VHF radio broadcasts. For Starting Area "CF" VHF channel 69 will be utilized. For Starting Area "NC", VHF channel 71 will be utilized. In emergencies, competitors may contact the Race Committee on these VHF channels.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- **4.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed from the halyards on the flagpole located on the StFYC Race Deck.
- 4.2 When AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the Race Signal AP. This changes Race Signal AP.
- 4.3 Flag B hoisted with one sound signal means "Protest time has begun". When lowered with one sound signal "Protest time has ended". This changes RRS Race Signals.

5.2 On the last day of the regatta no Warning Signal shall be made after 1430.

6. CLASS FLAGS

For One Design classes the class flag will be the class insignia on a white flag. For IRC Divisions, the class flags will be the black Division letter on a white flag.

7. RACING AREA

The Racing Area will be the San Francisco Bay and approaches.

8. THE COURSES

- **8.1** The courses are described on Attachment C Course Descriptions, except for the Farr 30 class.
- **8.2** Farr 30 class courses are described in Attachment E Course Descriptions.
- **8.2** A placard designating the course will be displayed from the Signal Boat prior to each class Warning Signal.

9. MARKS

The marks are described on Attachment B – Description of Marks.

10. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- **10.1 Boats** shall not pass through the areas bound by the following objects and the closest point ashore:
 - (a) The "H" Beam (located approximately 200 yards west of StFYC).
 - (b) Anita Rock and its Buoy "AR".
 - (c) The South Tower of the Golden Gate Bridge.
 - (d) The Bell Buoy off the west end of Alcatraz Island.
 - (e) The buoy south of Point Blunt on Angel Island.
 - (f) All breakwaters in the vicinity of Fisherman's Wharf and Aquatic Park.
 - (g) Round orange buoys set off of Piers 39 and 45 (if set).
 - (h) Round orange buoy set north of the StFYC Harbor entrance (if set).
- **10.2** The above-mentioned restricted areas are defined as obstructions.
- 10.3 A boat that breaks this rule may not correct her error per RRS 28.1 and shall retire. This changes RRS 28.1.

11. THE START

- **11.1** Starting areas:
 - (a) City Front Starting Area "CF" will be northwest of Treasure Island and approximately one NM from Mark 18.
 - (b) North Course Racing Circle Starting Area "NC" will be in the vicinity of the west end of the Berkeley Pier.
- 11.2 Races will be started using RRS 26. For the first race each day, the starting order will be the order stated in Sailing Instruction 5, Number & Schedule of Races. For all following races each day, the Race Committee will determine the starting order and signal the starts per RRS 26.
- 11.3 The Starting Line will be between staffs displaying orange and yellow striped flags on the Starting Line Boats.
- 11.4 The Race Committee may hail the sail number(s) of the boat(s) identified on the course side of the starting line by loud hailer and/or VHF radio. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat hearing the hail or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).
- 11.5 A boat that fails to start within 5 minutes of her starting signal shall be scored "DNS." This changes rule A4.1.

12. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a new mark identified by a black band and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

13. THE FINISH

Finish Lines:

- (a) "RD" between mark "A" (yellow can outer StFYC Buoy) and a yellow placard on the StFYC Race Deck.
- (b) "B" between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on a Race Committee boat and a yellow inflatable tetrahedron or cone set as the port end finishing mark. The finish line will be located approximately .3 NM at 330 degrees mag. from the northwest tip of Treasure Island.
- (c) "C"— between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on a Race Committee boat and a yellow inflatable tetrahedron or cone set as a port end finishing mark located approximately 200 yards upwind of T1 or W.
- (d) "D" between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on a Race Committee boat and a yellow inflatable tetrahedron or cone set as the port end finishing mark. The finish line will be located approximately 200 yards downwind of the gate.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 14.1 For the Farr 30, J120, and J105 classes RRS 44.1 is modified by adding the following: Except for a starting mark, the turns penalty for a Part 2 rule broken inside the zone shall be a Two-Turns Penalty as prescribed in this rule without modification. The turns penalty for a Part 2 rule broken outside the zone shall be a one turn, including one tack and one gybe. This changes RRS 44.1.
- **14.2** For all other classes, RRS 44.1 applies without modification.
- 14.3 The scoring penalty RRS 44.3 will apply, except for the Farr 30 class. The number shall be the whole number (rounding .5 upward) nearest to 30% of the number of boats entered. This modifies RRS 44.3(c). A boat that takes a Scoring Penalty in accordance with RRS 44.3 shall complete a penalty declaration form. Declaration forms will be available on the wall adjacent to the Official Notice Board. Completed forms must be lodged with the Jury Desk within the protest time limit (SI 17.1), as posted on the Official Notice Board.

15. TIME LIMIT FOR EACH RACE

- **15.1** The Time Limit for each race will be 4½ hours.
- **15.2** For One Design classes, a boat failing to finish within 45 minutes after the first boat in her class will be scored "DNF" by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 35 and A4.1.
- **15.3** For the IRC Divisions, a boat failing to finish within 90 minutes after the first boat in her division will be scored "DNF" by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 35 and A4.1.

16. PROTEST ARBITRATION

The provisions of Attachment A – Protest Arbitration apply.

17. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- **17.1** For all divisions and classes, protests and requests for redress shall be lodged with the Jury Representative at the Jury Desk.
- 17.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the hoisting of Flag B SI 4.3. The Race Committee will post on the Official Notice Board the end of the protest time limit when it displays Flag B ashore. The same time limit applies to protests by the Race Committee and Jury about incidents they observe in the racing area. This changes RRS 61.3 and 62.2.
- 17.3 The time and place of all hearing(s), the boat(s) protesting, boat(s) being protested and boat(s) requesting redress will be posted on the Official Notice Board. Notices of hearings will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. This shall serve as notification as per RRS 63.2.
- In an effort to make the arbitration and protest hearing process more user-friendly, the Jury will use a pager system to informally alert parties of impending hearings. Upon filing a protest or learning they are a party to a protest, parties should obtain a pager (coaster) from the Jury Representative at the Jury Desk. The Jury will attempt to page the parties approximately five minutes before the hearing is to begin. Pagers will be returned to the Jury Representative at the Jury Desk, or if the Jury Desk is closed, to the Jury at the hearing, and parties failing to return pagers will be charged for the cost of the pager. Failure of the Jury to make a page or failure of a party to hear a page shall not be grounds for redress. Except for RRS 69, at the discretion of the Jury, hearings will take place as scheduled, with or without the presence of all parties.
- 17.5 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered (a) within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day (b) no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day.
- 17.6 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a jury decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.
- 17.7 Breaches of Sailing Instruction 19, 22, 23, 24, 29, and 30 will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes Racing Rule 60.1(a). At the discretion of the Jury, penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification.
- **17.8** Decisions of the Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.
- **17.9** Farr 30 Class only Video and photos taken from any support boat and/or coach boat shall not be used as evidence at protest hearings. This changes RRS 63.6.

18. SCORING

- **18.1** The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply, except each boat's score will be the sum of her scores for all races. This changes RRS A2.
- **18.2** One race must be completed to constitute a series in all classes except Farr 30.
- **18.3** For the Farr 30 class, five races must be completed to constitute a series.
- **18.4** Scoring Inquiry Forms must be submitted in writing to the Jury Desk. Race Committee responses to these written inquiries will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

19. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 Competitors shall wear adequate personal buoyancy while racing, except for brief periods while changing or adjusting clothing. The "Y" flag will not be displayed. This changes RRS 27.1 and 40.
- 19.2 The provisions of Attachment D Commercial Traffic, Safety apply.
- 19.3 A boat retiring from a race, or one that leaves the race area between races, where practical, shall notify the Race Committee on the water as soon as possible, or the race office immediately after arrival ashore

20. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT (FARR 30 CLASS ONLY)

- **20.1** Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the Race Committee.
- **20.2** Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the Race Committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the Committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

21. EQUIPMENT AND MEASURMENT CHECKS (FARR 30 CLASS ONLY)

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a Race Committee equipment inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

22. ADVERTISING, BOW STICKERS AND BACKSTAY FLAGS

- **22.1** All boats are required to display Rolex bow stickers, supplied by the Organizing Authority, to both sides of the hull as indicated by the sticker placement and application instruction sheet, which will be supplied with the bow stickers.
- 22.2 The Farr 30 class is required to display bow number stickers as supplied and designated by the Organizing Authority.
- 22.3 Rolex backstay flags supplied at registration are required to be flown while racing. The backstay flag should be flown from the backstay approximately three feet above the deck when possible.

23. SUPPORT BOATS

- 23.1 Due to limited dock space, support boats will not have access to the StFYC Guest Docks unless assigned dock space by the StFYC Dock Master.
- 23.2 Support boats shall register at the StFYC Race Office prior to the end of registration on Wednesday Sept. 7. They must be prepared to declare the name(s) of all boats that they are attached to, the name of the support boat operator, and his/her cellular phone number. Support boats will be issued a flag and will be required to leave a \$20 deposit which will be refunded to the representative upon the return of the flag at the end of the regatta.
- For all classes except the Farr 30 Class; except when rendering assistance to a boat in danger, at the boat's request or at the request of the Race Committee all support boats must stay clear and outside of Race Committee boats or boats flying a Jury flag or Press flag at all rounding marks, start and finish lines. Support boats must stay clear from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boats have finished or retired or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- **23.4** The Farr 30 Class shall comply with Class Rule 33.0 OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE

24. TRASH DISPOSAL

Boats shall not dispose of trash in the water.

25. HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

All boats shall remain in the water from the Warning Signal of their first race through completion of their final race of the series except with and according to the terms of prior permission of the Race Committee.

26. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the top three place finishers in each class. When a class exceeds twenty-five entrants trophies will be awarded to the top five place finishers. In addition the following perpetual trophies will be awarded: St. Francis Perpetual, City of San Francisco Perpetual, Atlantic Perpetual, Keefe-Kilbourne Memorial, Richard Rheem Perpetual and Commodore's Cup. The Royal Canadian Yacht Club trophy will be presented to the overall winner of the Farr 30 World Championship.

27. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

28. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid and adequate third-party liability insurance.

29. TRACKING

- **29.1** GPS tracking of boats will be used for public media purposes and to provide displays onshore. Information from the tracking system shall not be used as evidence, or be used as a basis for a protest or request for redress by either the Race Committee or a boat, although the International Jury may use available information from the system at their discretion. This changes RRS 60.1 and 60.2.
- **29.2** The following procedure shall be followed:
 - a) Each boat shall personally collect their tracking device at registration.
 - b) When returning ashore after the last race on Sunday, September 11 a representative from each boat shall personally return the tracking device to a desk outside the Regatta Entrance. Boats must return tracking devices prior to the protest time limit.
 - c) Any boat failing to comply with this procedure may get a penalty of 5 points for each race of the day without a protest hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

30. BERTHING AND TRAILER STORAGE

- **30.1** Boats may be moored, free of charge, at the StFYC docks from Monday, September 5 through Monday, September 12. When not racing, all boats shall remain in their assigned berth in the San Francisco Marina.
- **30.2** Storage trailers for boats shall be stored at the direction of the Dockmaster and registered with a Race Office representative. All unregistered storage trailers may be ticketed and towed.
