**100 Boats on a Beer Can
Amendment No. 1 to Sailing Instructions**

Section 6, relating to “Class Flags” is deleted and replaced with the following (with new language in italics):

See Section 15. Boats need not fly class flags. *The Race Committee will fly a Section 1 pennant as a class flag for all starters in connection with the starting sequence.*

Section 8, relating to “Check-In/Check-Out” is deleted and replaced with the following (with new language in italics):

On Tuesday, August 6th, when arriving at the starting area, boats should approach the Race Committee boat(s), hail their sail number, and receive acknowledgement from the Race Committee. On Wednesday, August 7th, when arriving at the starting area, boats should check in with the “check-in” boat flying code flag “L,” which will be stationed approximately 500 yards to the west of the starting line, so as not to interfere with pre-start maneuvers of competitors. If a boat must withdraw from the race, it must notify the Race Committee via VHF 78.

Section 9.1.2, relating to Courses, is deleted and replaced with the following (with new language in italics):

Boats starting at the Central Area shall proceed to the Dever Crib, rounding it to starboard, proceed to the Four Mile Crib, rounding it to starboard, and proceed to the finish at the Central Area. The Race Committee may elect to run a “Short Course,” and if so, will signal the use of the Short Course on a white placard. If the Race Committee calls a Short Course, boats shall start at the *Central Area*, proceed to the Dever Crib, rounding it to starboard, proceed directly to a gate bounded by two orange tetrahedrons, oriented north to south, located approximately .5 miles east of the Central Area, pass through the gate from east to west, and proceed to the finish at the Central Area.

Section 9.1.3, relating to Courses, is deleted and replaced with the following (with new language in italics):

Boats starting at the South Area shall proceed to the Four Mile Crib, rounding it to port, and proceed to the finish at the Central Area. The Race Committee may elect to run a “Short Course,” and if so, will signal the use of the Short Course on a white placard. If the Race Committee calls a Short Course, boats shall start at the *South Area*, proceed directly to a gate bounded by two orange tetrahedrons, oriented north to south, located approximately .5 miles east of the Central Area, pass through the gate from east to west, and proceed to the finish at the Central Area.

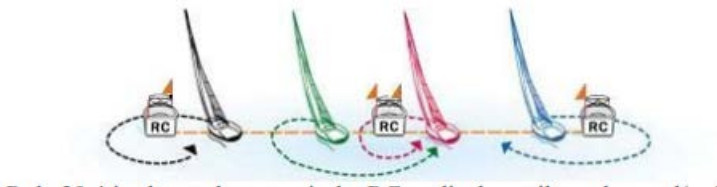
Section 11.2, relating to the Start, is deleted and replaced with the following:

On Wednesday, August 7th, 2019, all boats will start in the Central Area. It is the intent of the Race Committee to start all boats on a single start line. The starting line will consist of three race committee boats: the port end line boat, the mid-line signal boat; and the starboard end line boat. The starting line will be two line segments: one between a staff displaying an orange flag on the mid-line signal boat and a staff displaying an orange flag on the port end line boat, the other between a staff displaying an orange flag on the mid-line signal boat and a staff displaying an orange flag on the starboard end line boat. Individual and General Recall flags may be displayed by the race committee pin end line boats.

On Wednesday, August 7th, T-10s (including LS 10s), Beneteau 36.7s, J-105s, J-109s, and J-88s shall start between the port end line boat and the signal boat. All other boats shall start between the signal boat and the starboard end line boat.

Section 11.3, relating to the Start, is added as follows:

For races on Wednesday, August 7th, RRS 30.1, the I flag rule, is modified so that boats subject to RRS 30.1 shall thereafter sail from the course side, across an extension of either end, or around the mid line boat, leaving it to port as if it were the port end of the starting line and to the precourse side before starting. (See diagram below.) This modifies RRS 30.1.



Section 11.4, relating to the Start is delated and replaced as follows (with new language in italics):

For Tuesday, August 6th races, any boat starting more than 10 minutes after its class's start will be scored DNS. For Wednesday, August 7th racing, any boat starting more than 20 minutes after its class's start will be scored DNS.

Section 16.1, relating to Section Breaks and Scoring, is deleted.
